New Jersey Veterinary Licensing Requirements



Board Applications

1. Application

- 1. Register with the NJ Division of Consumer Affairs to obtain your log-in.
- 2. Complete the <u>application online</u>.
- **3.** Send application, school transcripts/license verification(s), and test scores electronically to **VeterinaryMed@dca.njoag.gov AND** mail a paper copy of application with check to:

All documents must be submitted within 6 months. It's recommended you submit as much supporting information as possible if you answered "Yes" on any of the questions.

Requirements

- RECENT GRADUATES: Must have graduated from an <u>AVMA accredited veterinary</u> <u>college</u> in the current academic year OR meet the requirements of either the ECFVG or PAVE. Transcripts/certificates must be sent directly from the institution and in English.
- 2. **RECIPROCITY APPLICANTS:** Applicants who hold licenses in another state, territory, or Washington D.C. must be licensed in good standing, and you must have practiced veterinary medicine for 2 of the past 5 years. The state board(s) must submit license documentation directly to the New Jersey Board.
- 3. Must pass the NAVLE within 10 years prior to initial application. You can send your scores using the **AAVSB's VAULT service** for a fee of \$99.

It takes about 5 to 7 weeks for licenses to be processed.





2. Relevant Fees

1. TOTAL: \$218.75 to \$343.75

- a. Application Fee: \$75 (paid by check or money order)
- b. Criminal Background Check: \$18.75
- c. Registration fee (sent after application approved): \$250 or \$125 in second year of renewal period
- 2. Make checks payable to the "State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners"

3. Other Documentation

1. Criminal History Background check and Fingerprint Scan:

- a. After applying, you will receive a letter with instructions to schedule an appointment to have your fingerprints scanned. The scan takes 7 to 10 days to process, so it's recommended you schedule your fingerprint scan appointment as soon as possible.
- b. There are currently 17 eligible fingerprint scan locations in New Jersey, you don't need to wait for an appointment near you.
- 2. If your name has changed, include any associated documents.



4. Additional Required Testing

- 1. New Jersey Jurisprudence Orientation, found <u>here</u>.
 - a. Must answer all questions in a single online session.
 - b. Must receive a score of 70 or above to pass.
 - c. If you fail the exam, you may retake it but will have to re-pay the \$75 application fee.

Renewal and Reinstatement

RENEWAL: Licenses must be renewed every 2 years and expire on June 30th of odd years.

- 1. Renewal forms are mailed 60 days prior to expiration; keep your address current.
- 2. Renewal Fee: **\$250**
- 3. Must include name, contact info, and other details for each veterinary clinic where you intend to practice 500 hours or more in the upcoming two years.
- 4. **LATE RENEWAL:** You may renew for up to 30 days after your license expires and practice during this time but must pay a \$100 late fee. After this period, your license is suspended.

REINSTATEMENT/REACTIVATION: Complete <u>Reinstatement Application</u> and pay **\$250** reinstatement fee (\$125 in 2nd year of renewal period) + **\$250** per lapsed period licensure. Must include:

- 1. If you have held a license in another state during the lapsed period, you must submit a letter of good standing from all states where you've been licensed.
- 2. Signed and dated certification of each job held during lapsed period.
- 3. Proof of CE credits (can be waived if you completed another state's CE requirements).
- 4. If inactive for more than 5 years, you must retake the Jurisprudence Orientation
- 5. A new criminal background check is required for each renewal period (\$18.75 fee).



CE Requirements:

- 1. **20 hours** of CE are required every 2 year renewal period. Only 10 hours are required if you obtained your license during the second year of a biennial renewal period.
 - a. At least 17 hours must be in medicine, surgery, or dentistry.
 - b. No more than 4 hours can be in business management courses.
 - c. I hour must be on the topic of prescription opioid drugs.
- 2. Courses must be approved or sponsored by the NJVMA, AVMA, AAVSB, RACE, VIN, or a college or university. CE credit can also be earned by:
 - a. I hour of CE (5 hours max) can be earned by completing a self-assessment test from a peer reviewed journal issued by an AVMA approved veterinary schools
 - b. 3 hours of CE can be earned by writing an article in a peer reviewed journal.
 - c. Up to 10 CE hours can be earned teaching a new CE program approved by one of the above organizations. I hour earned per hour taught.
 - d. Up to 2 hours CE earned for providing free veterinary care to a person eligible for any program for public, family, or medical assistance OR a feral/stray cat without an owner in a shelter, pound, or municipally approved cat colony. I hour CE earned per two hours volunteer work performed.
- 3. Retain all documentation and certificates received.
- 4. CE requirements can be waived by the Board for good cause such as hardship, illness, disability, or military service. Must apply for waiver 90 days before your license expires.





FAQ:

Do you need to be a citizen of the United States to be eligible for a license?

No. You can obtain a veterinary license in New Jersey regardless of citizenship. Social security numbers are not required. Even undocumented individuals are eligible.

What if I have been arrested for or convicted of a crime?

You must submit a detailed letter of explanation, including all relevant police reports, judgements, sentencing orders, termination of probation orders, and evidence of rehabilitation to the Board.
