# **Board Applications**

# 1. Application

State and national requirements

- **a)** If you have graduated from an <u>AVMA accredited college</u>, you must have proof of attendance, graduation and a transcript, which should be submitted by your college.
- **b)** If you are NOT from an accredited veterinary college, you will need either a certificate of completion of the Education Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates program, or sufficient clinical education equal to that of students in AVMA accredited schools.

# 2 Relevant Fees

- \$375.00 Fee after the first day of March if submitted on an even numbered year
- · Consists of:
  - \$250.00 Fee after the first day of March if submitted on an odd numbered year
  - \$44.00 Comprehensive fees for undergoing a background check





# Verify additional existing veterinary licenses:

- 1. If you are or have ever been licensed to practice in another state, U.S. territory or Canadian province, verification forms must be submitted by the respective licensing boards.

## Additional Required Testing:

- 1. Prior to applying, you must have passed the NAVLE with a score of 75.00 or higher.
- You can apply for this exam through the ICVA.

# **Mandatory Documentation:**

- 1. In Ohio, by submitting an application for a veterinary license, you consent to undergoing a background check, and are required to inform the board whether or not you have been convicted of criminal charges in the past.

## **Temporary License:**

In Ohio, temporary licenses are available for interns and resident students, under supervision of a fully licensed veterinarian.



### FAQ:

"I'm licensed in another state within the U.S., and therefore have passed the NAVLE. Do I still need to complete a license application, and if so, which parts?"

- If you are currently licensed and practicing in another state, you are exempt from the licensure by examination requirements, and can be granted a license via reciprocity.
  - a. This license requires verified proof of previous/current licenses in other states, meaning that the states in which you currently hold a license will need to submit verification of your license to the OVMA.
  - b. There are potential licensing fees of \$425 or \$300, depending on if you submit your application on an even numbered or odd numbered year, respectively.

### "What are the Continuing Education Requirements in Ohio?"

- All fully-licensed veterinarians in Illinois are required to fulfill their CE, which entails a minimum of 30 hours of Continuing Education coursework every two years.
