1. Application

State and national requirements

- a) If you have graduated from an AVMA accredited college, you must have proof of attendance, graduation, and a transcript, which should be submitted by your college.
- b) If you are NOT from an accredited veterinary college, you will need either a certificate of completion of the Education Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates program, or sufficient clinical education equal to that of students in AVMA accredited schools.

Verify Additional Existing Veterinary Licenses:

1. If you are or have ever been licensed to practice in another state, U.S. territory, or Canadian province, verification forms must be submitted by the respective licensing boards.

Additional Required Testing:

- 1. Prior to applying, you must have passed the NAVLE (for previously unlicensed applicants, you must have passed within the last five years).
 - You can apply for this exam through the ICVA.
- 2. There is no separate state licensing exam in Virginia.

Mandatory Documentation:

 In Virginia, by submitting an application for a veterinary license, you consent to undergoing a background check and are required to inform the board whether or not you have been convicted of criminal charges in the past.

Temporary License:

• In Virginia, temporary licenses are available for interns and resident students under supervision of a fully licensed veterinarian.



FAQ:

"I'm licensed in another state within the U.S., and therefore have passed the NAVLE. Do I still need to complete a license application, and if so, which parts?"

- If you are licensed in another state and have completed clinical practice for at least two of the past four years, you qualify for licensure via Endorsement in Virginia.
 - 1. This license requires verified proof of previous/current licenses in other states, meaning that the states in which you currently hold a license will need to submit verification of your license to the Virginia Department of State.
 - 2. Endorsement licenses require documentation of clinical practices from the past four years, submitted to the board for examination.
 - 3. Additionally, you will need to have completed 30 hours of Containing Education work within the past two years.

"What are the Continuing Education Requirements in Virginia?"

- All fully-licensed veterinarians in Illinois are required to fulfill their CE, which entails a minimum of 15 hours of Continuing Education coursework every year.

 - b. In Virginia, if you have an active license, there is a \$175 renewal fee to be paid annually.
